Where can we eat lunch?

Many groups choose to eat on the lawn or plaza area by Confederate Hall Historical and Environmental Education Center. A children's playground with picnic tables and bathrooms is located 1 mile from Confederate Hall and is most appropriate for Elementary grades. Picnic tables, two small pavilions and bathrooms are located near the Grist Mill, across from the Quarry Exhibit. You may also choose to eat on the Great Lawn in front of the carving (behind Memorial Hall). All other Pavilions in the Park must be reserved.

How do I contact someone the morning of our trip?

Please call the main line at 770.498.5658. You may have to leave a message but we are diligent about checking these messages.

What if it rains the day of our field trip?

If inclement weather arises during your program time our activities will change, we will cover similar material indoors. If your group cannot come because of weather, we will work with you to reserve another date.

What if we arrive late?

If you arrive late to your program we will do our best to be flexible and do as much as we can with the remaining time. We can not continue more than ½ hour after your scheduled time to finish.

What if my principal/administrator does not approve of the trip?

We would be willing to speak directly with your administrator. All of our programs are correlated to Georgia Performance Standards. We are willing to fill out paper work or provide our lesson plans if this helps get your trip approved.

What chaperone to student ratio do you prefer?

We prefer you to have 1 chaperone for every 10 students.

What if my team teachers or chaperones do not feel they can complete the hike to the top of the mountain or other physical requirements of your scheduled field trip?

There must be at least 1 school representative that can remain with each class for the entire program. If the team teacher is not sure he/she can complete the program, please try to find an administrator or other school representative that can go with his/her class.
